What is Locally Led Conservation?

Locally led conservation consists of a series of phases that involve community stakeholders in natural resource planning, implementation of solutions, and evaluation of results. Locally led conservation begins with the community itself, working through the local conservation district.

On May 24th 2022 the Windham County Conservation District held a virtual Local Working Group. There members vocalized early in the conversation the importance of invasive species control. The entire Local Working Group agreed that it is a dire problem here in the South Zone that needs to be controlled before spreading further north. After reviewing the Tactical Basin Plans it was clear that there is a need for us to create a local fund pool proposal to support invasive species control.

Conservation Practice Funding

Funding will be available for the 2023 federal fiscal year to eligible landowners through the EQIP local fund pool. NRCS will provide a total of \$150 thousand in financial assistance for approved conservation practices for the purpose of addressing resource concerns. Land and producer eligibility must be met to participate in this initiative.

Resource Concerns Addressed

- Pest Pressure
- Degraded Plant Condition
- Concentrated Erosion
- Aquatic Habitat
- Soil Quality Limitations
